IN RE: GENERAL ORDER OF THE **FAX FILING FEES** PRESIDING JUDGE

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Superior Court of California, County of San Bernardino was closed from March 17, 2020 through May 28, 2020, and only hearing essential, time-sensitive matters in accordance with emergency orders and statewide orders issued by Chief Justice Tani Cantil-Sakauye, countywide and statewide orders issued by the San Bernardino County Public Health Officer and the State Public Health Officer, executive orders issued by Governor Gavin Newsom, and general implementation orders issued by the court.

Public health agencies, including the CDC, the California Department of Public Health, and local county health departments have recommended stringent social distancing measures of at least six feet between people, and they encourage vulnerable individuals to avoid public gatherings and spaces. They have also required essential businesses to proactively manage social distancing and other safety and health measures. (The State of California has deemed courts essential businesses).

GENERAL ORDER: FAX FILING FEES

These mandates impact the court's ability to provide services, process new and existing case filings, and perform other court work.

In her March 30, 2020 statewide orders, the Chief Justice encouraged courts to use technology to conduct judicial proceedings and court operations remotely to protect the health and safety of the public, court personnel, judicial officers, litigants, and witnesses. After careful deliberation, the court has concluded that requiring court users to file certain court documents through courthouse drop boxes, by mail, facsimile, or through online options is the most reasonable and measured way of protecting the health and safety of the public and court personnel by reducing in-person contact at the court.

Consequently, pursuant to California Rules of Court, Rules 10.603 and 10.815, and the Chief Justice's March 30, 2020 statewide order, the court HEREBY ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:

From June 4, 2020 through August 31, 2020, facsimile filing fees shall be waived for any documents filed by facsimile pursuant to California Rules of Court, Rules 2.250 et seq.

THIS ORDER IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY.
